ARGYLL CENSUS; MCGILVRAYS

"Inhabitants of the Argyll Estate" by Eric Cregeen, 1963
Scottish Record Soc. Available on Mormon film.

This was a complete census of people on Argyll's lands in 1779. As such, it didn't include Pennyghael or other heritor's lands such as Lochbuie, or similar areas in Lorne. Brolass, was included as its court case was not concluded. As both Brolass & Pennyghael were on the 1716 list (Appendix 3) it is possible to estimate the size of the 1779 Pennyghael estate. It is not certain if those men who were away with the Fencibles were listed although Neil McGilvray was included. There were no McGilvrays on the Duke's lands in Aros or Torosay. Regrettably, Mull's female names & their ages were omitted.

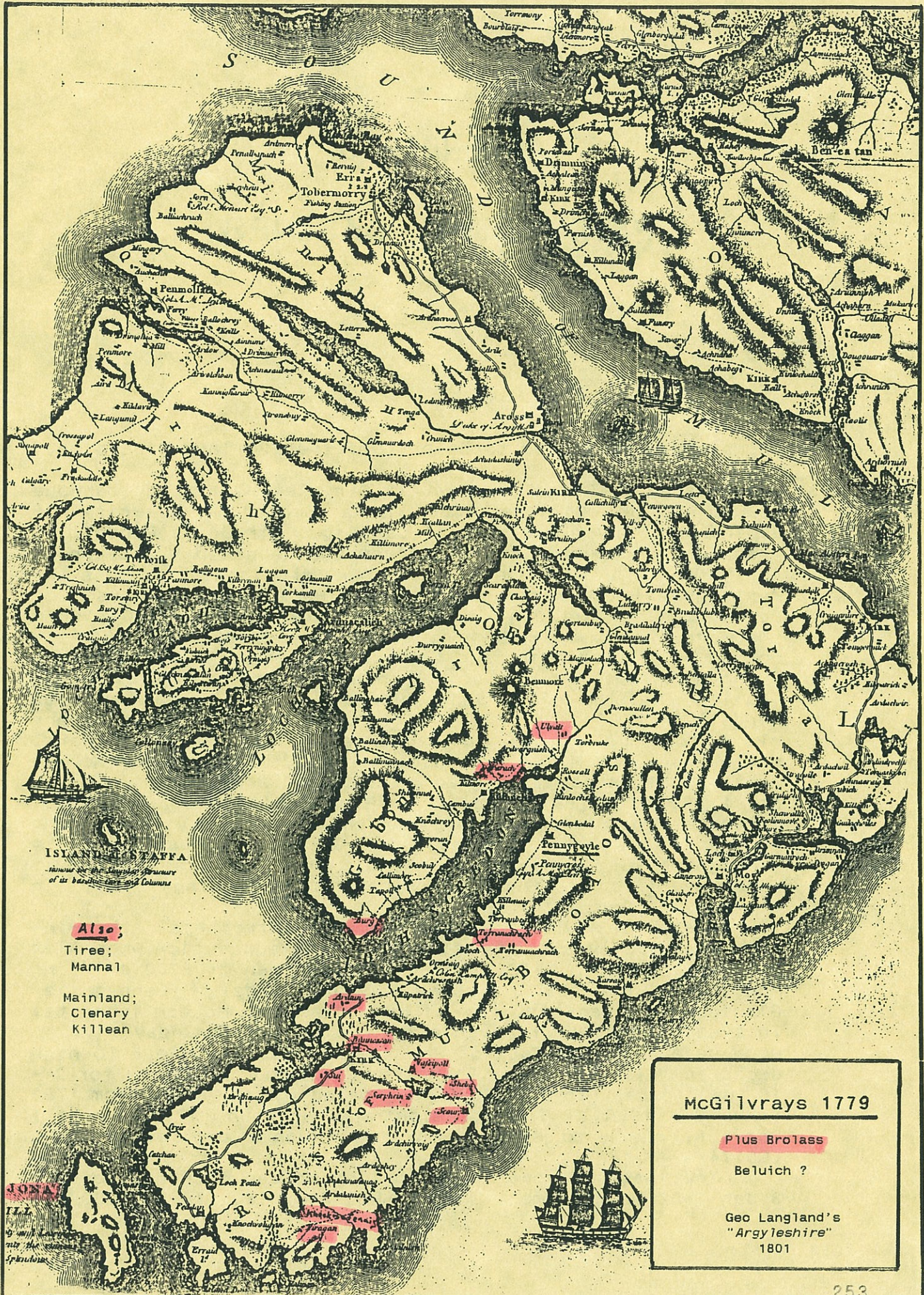

This 1779 list shows 26 men between the ages of 14-60. If the 1716 figures for the 1779 non-surveyed areas are added, there would be an additional three men for Pennyghael & another three men for Kilninian. This adjusted total of 32 compares to the 31 in 1716. It appears the 6 men in 1716 Torosay (who were not listed there in 1779) have been displaced. Did they return to Brolass/Ross?

Similarly adjusting the above 21 McGilvray households, to include Pennyghael & Torosay, gives 26 for all of Mull. Such a very conservative estimate is risky given that Argyll's lands in 1801 represented only 32% of the population in Kilninian & in Torosay, & 55% in Kilfinichen. But, church & census records confirm there were relatively few McGilvrays in those other lands. A very liberal guess would be 30 households.

It's strange that the number of McGilvrays didn't increase during these two peaceful generations. Comparisons with other families is risky because later church records indicate a surprisingly large number of McGilvrays remain single & those that marry often have small families. It is known that the above 96 McGilvrays represent a mere 6½% of the total Ross & Brolass Argyll population. We were not a numerous clan. The average McGilvray household was only 4.6 persons (2.6 adults & 2 kids). Large families were not the McGilvray norm.

A further comparison with the 1675 figures of 34 men indicates the numbers of McGilvrays had actually decreased during the preceding generation, likely due to the disasters of the late 1600's. Emigration was not yet a factor. Although there would soon be a major migration from Mull to Glasgow, church records indicate there were only a half dozen McGilvray families there c1780.

APPENDIX 5

PENNYGHAEL SASINES

SRO

(Pennyghael is stated to be part of the £20 land of Brolas)

1731 July 3 (reg'd 1801 RD2/283/841) Sir Alex Murray of Stanhope loaned Alex McGilvra 3000 merks Scots on security of Benininagh, which was part of Carsaig. Sir James Riddell of Ardnamurchan bought this note from the deceased Murray on 11 Aug 1767. (In effect, he actually owns the land, i.e. gets the rents, until the mortgage is paid) He's suing Hugh (son of deceased Alex) in 1781 for rent arrears. (Reg'd 1801; when the word is out that Hugh is selling; RD2/283/848) Hugh is forced to give up this land & there is a dispute over the land lying between the hill of Benninah & the shore of Beach (called Innichmore). Judge Bannatyne gave Benininich to Riddell in 1786/7 or 1791? On 4 Feb 1793, Hugh gives up any claim to this parcel in exchange for any rent arrears. Witnesses; John McRae, schoolmaster at Carsaig; Allan McLean residing at Carsaig. Signed at Glasgow, 2 Sept 1801.

1781 Nov 2/15; (52) [PR 12 -86] Hugh McGilvra of Pennyghael mortgages his lands to Dr Alex McLean of Pennycross (who married Hugh's sister Una) for £700. Lands listed = Pennyghael (3 farthing); Glenleidle ($\frac{1}{2}$ d.); Carsaig (1 d.); Finachay (3 farthing); Feorlein (3 farthing): all in Kilfinichen Par, Mull.

Alex McLean had obtained Pennycross from his father-in-law, Alex McGilvray (by Sasine #395), in succession when Alex McGilvray died in 1778. For the above loan of £700 sterling McLean was heritably secured on the lands of Pennygaile, Glenleudile & Carsaig. i.e. if Hugh dies then McLean inherits. This Back Bond was repayable by the next Whitsunday (1782). Hugh gave also the Tack of Pennygaile, Glenleudile, & Tornigh Uachdrach (likely Torran Iochdarach - just E of Beach) for 2 - 19 year leases (to ?). £500 was loaned for 19 years from 1781 (thus due 1800). The agreement was written (1781) by Neil Darrait, clerk to Gillean McLaine (Hugh's brother-in-law). (GD174/171 1782)

The lease of some lands to Alex McLean of Pennycross in 3 Jan 1782 is also mentioned in RD2/284/815. In RD4/269/477

dated 3 Jan 1782; before Gillean McLean, writer in Mull; but signed 20 Mar 1801 (or 1797?), Hugh gives a Pennyghael tack to Alex McLean of Pennycross. Glen Liddell is now possessed (rented) by Neil McEachan & Alex McDonald. McLean can cut trees at Carsaig to build his house. There is a mill (for grain) at Pennyghael.

- In an earlier Heritable Bond, between Hugh McGilvra & Arch McLean (Alex's father), Hugh borrowed £200. (RD3/274 p.305)
- 1794 June 18; (808) [Gr 532 - 256] Hugh mortgages Feorling & Knocknabroich (likely a nearby hill) to Arch MacLean (the son & heir of Dr Alex) of Pennycross, for £200.
- 1801 Aug 28; (1304) [GR 643.48] The £700 mortgage (1781 above) is transferred from Dr Alex to Arch McLean.
- 1802 11 Mar/1 Oct 1802; (1384) [GR 663.210] Hugh sells the ½d Glenliddle & 3f of Pennyghael, 1d Carsaig, 3f Finachy & 1f Feorline; to John MacDougall of Lunga. The burden? on the land is £4000 & a liferent of £30 is given to Hugh.
- 1803 Mar 7/19; (1422) [GR 672.60] & (3152) [GR 1164.245] Arch MacLean of Pennycross (nephew of Hugh) buys the land from J. McDougall, with the consent of Don MacLean w.s. (wadsetter?) The burden on the land is £3100 & a £30 annuity to Hugh. Finalized Mar 14, 1814 by Colin McDougall (son & heir to John) of Lunga. However, in 1808 (#1862) Arch McLean of Pennycross put up everything for a loan; & borrows more in 1810 (#2035).
- 1813 Aug 30; (2318) [RS3 or GR 954.26] Katherine McLean (relict of Hugh) & Isabel McGilvray (wife of John McKinnon, mariner, Greenock) & Unna, Cath & Mary Ann (daughters of Hugh; who had powers of attorney signed) get liferent in lands under security bond of £600 by Arch MacLean of Pennycross. (son Alex isn't mentioned); Dunc McFadyen is Pennycross servant. Is this the £600 of Lochbuie's Reg'd at Edinburgh?; Kath's lawyer= Arch McKinnon at Pennycross (2317); witnesses; Arch McLean of Pennycross & his son Alex.
- 1813 Nov 20; (3151) [GR 1164 - 240] Colin McDougall (Lunga), son & heir of John, gets Ren (retoured) by the factor for Isabella McGilvra, daughter of late Hugh of Pennyghael, & John McKinnon (her husband) & curator for Unna, Catherine (daughters of late Hugh; & factor loco tutoris for Mary Ann, the other daughter; & factor loco absentis for Alex, son of Hugh (no other son mentioned); & factor for Catherine McLean, relict of Hugh (re above lands) regarding the £4000 & liferent annuity of £30 in disp. by Hugh to J MacDougall.
- 1819 Sept 1/5; (3086) [GR 1141.43] Murdoch MacLean (Lochbuie) purchaser, gets Ren by Alex McGilvray (son & heir for late Hugh of Pennyghael) & residing at Pennycross; with consent of Alex McLean (residing at Pennyghael) of above lands (or the ½p of Glenliddle) & of £3100 balance of £4000 & an annuity of £30 in disp by Hugh to John McDougall (Lunga), Mar 11, 1802; & on disp by him, with consent of Don McLean w.s. to Arch McLean, Pennycross. Mar 7, 1803.
- 1819 Feb 19; (3098/9) (3205) Wm MacGillivray of Montreal buys.
- 1826 Argyll #914; 23 Aug Riddell vs Alex "eldest son & heir of late Hugh of Pennyghael". Alex gives up all claims. (GR 1427.200)
