Plosive will bring familiar favourites and exciting new discoveries to Ottawa stages with one thing in common: they are great stories told by some of Ottawa's best actors, directors and designers. David, Kel and Teri have, among them, worked for a vast range of professional companies. Locally, this includes the Great Canadian Theatre Company, a Company of Fools, Third Wall Theatre, SevenThirty Productions, New Ottawa Repertory Theatre, New Theatre of Ottawa, Vision Theatre, Gladstone Productions and the St. Lawrence Shakespeare Festival, to name but a few. With a cooperative attitude and a readiness to co-produce, **Plosive** will help grow this already-thriving Ottawa theatre scene with our own "audience first" approach. We're demonstrating that commitment to cooperation by making our first show a co-production with SevenThirty Productions and close collaboration with Gladstone Productions.

Plosive will ring in the new year—and our new company!—with Oscar Wilde's classic comedy of manners and romance, *The Importance of Being Earnest*, at The Gladstone February 10th to 26th. If you haven't booked for opening night, you're out of luck—it's already sold out! Director David Whiteley and designer Andrea Robertson are packing up this "*Trivial Comedy for Serious People*" and loading it on an elephant bound for India of the British Raj—a setting that underscores the frivolous nature of the leisure class in a time and place when only "mad dogs and Englishmen" went out in the midday sun. The production features Katie Bunting, Sean Conforti, Teri Loretto, Stewart Matthews, Kel Parsons, Garret Quirk, Chris Ralph, Henna Kaur Sodhi, and Bronwyn Steinberg.
