The BC Intentional Community Family: Looking At The Numbers (Aug 2009)

The large ic site, www.ic.org, had 128 listings for ic's in Canada. Of those, 53 were located in BC.

Approximately **half** of the **53** listing are established communities (physical realities) and half are still at the idea or planning stage. There are approximately **15** co-housing or shared housing communities and **5** ecovillages included in these **53** BC listings.

Two years ago at this time (Aug 2007) the total ic listings for BC were **35**; so it seems our family is growing! Please be aware that these Aug 2009 numbers only represent those communities that **want to be identified.** I'm guessing that there may be an equal number of ic's who for legal, political, philosiphical, or other reasons exist but don't want to be known to the authorities. Should or would they be welcome in the FBCIC community? Your feedback please.

A Land Acquitition Guide for Forming Communities

There are over 25 forming communities in BC at this time as well as individuals who want to buy rural land and create ic's. For these groups and individuals buying land will become an important activity in the next few years. To support this process I've created a **Land Acquitition Guide** that lists some of the different factors to consider when buying rural land.
